	He / She / It is not very intelligent,	is he / she / it?
	We / You / They are not at home,	are we / you / they?

	Other verbs statements	Tag question
Affirmative	I look elegant,	don't I?
	He / She / It eats a lot of ham,	doesn't he / she / it?
	We / You / They love museums,	don't we / you / they?
Negative	I don't study here,	do I?

Would	You wouldn't ride a horse,	would you?

	Simple past statements	Tag question
To bo	I was very little,	wasn't I?
To be	We weren't ready for the exam,	were we?
