Affirmative	I am a good chef,	aren't I?
	He / She / It is a nice friend,	isn't he / she / it?
	We / You / They are in Mexico,	aren't we / you / they?
Negative	I am not a doctor,	am I?
	He / She / It is not very intelligent,	is he / she / it?
	We / You / They are not at home,	are we / you / they?

	Other verbs statements	Tag question
Affirmative	I look elegant,	don't I?
	He / She / It eats a lot of ham,	doesn't he / she / it?
	We / You / They love museums,	don't we / you / they?
Negative	I don't study here,	do I?
	He / She / It doesn't drink coffee,	does he / she / it?
	We / You / They don't cook well,	do we / you / they?

- Use tag questions with a raising intonation to reassure information you already know.
- Use tag questions with a falling intonation to confirm information you are not sure about.

	Modal verb statements	Tag question
Could	You could read Italian,	couldn't you?
	She couldn't dance salsa,	could she?
Should	We should be quiet,	shouldn't we?
	He shouldn't run,	should he?
Would	I would buy that,	wouldn't I?
	You wouldn't ride a horse,	would you?

	Simple past statements	Tag question
To be	I was very little,	wasn't I?
	We weren't ready for the exam,	were we?
Other verbs	I saw a ghost,	didn't I?
	They didn't do the homework,	did they?

For sentences with *Let's*, use *shall* for the tag questions. For example, *Let's go to the park, shall we?*

- Illustration connectors are used to introduce examples of a previous idea.
- Cause and effect connectors are used to join ideas that express that one thing is the result of another.
- Addition connectors are used to add or introduce new information.
